The Minimum Energy Efficiency Standards for properties in the private rented sector were introduced in April of this year. These regulations are particularly challenging for owners and managers of portfolios of older buildings. This is worsened by MEES being based around EPCs that often do not accurately reflect a building's actual performance.

The workshop includes:

- An update on the regulations from BEIS
- Developing practical responses to meet the targets by portfolio owners
- Exploring the inconsistencies between reducing energy use and improving EPC scores

During two contributory sessions, delegates will have the opportunity to share both the challenges they are facing, and the solutions being considered and implemented.
